NiYelle is a beautiful, vibrant 7th grader in Clearview Regional MS who is currently battling Renal Failure, which is most commonly known as Chronic Kidney Disease. Children with kidney disease that leads to kidney failure must receive treatment to replace the work the kidneys should be doing. NiYelle receives dialysis treatment between 3-5 times a week while waiting for a transplant that will ultimately save her life and allow her to live as a healthy child.
