2019 Summer Session Descriptions

Grade levels are for incoming students as of 9/1/2019

Anatomy and Physiology I: This Course covers many of the standards and activities offered in the yearlong Anatomy and Physiology course. It includes similar tests, quizzes and labs that an anatomy and physiology student would have in the high school. Areas of study include: skeletal, muscular and nervous systems; endocrine, cardiovascular, respiratory, digestive and reproductive systems. Concepts to be covered include: development, metabolism, and balance. *NOTE: Students earn 2.5 HS credits upon successful completion of this course. Students will be required to complete work outside of class time. Students who complete this course will be eligible to enroll in Anatomy and Physiology II at the high school. (Grades 11 to 12) ***Out of district students welcomed***

College Application Essay Bootcamp: A two-day bootcamp where students will learn the ingredients for a great essay and prepare their own. (Grades 11 and 12) ***Out of district students welcomed***

Computer/Digital Literacy: Computer/Digital Literacy Summer Session Students will be given time to learn about the basics of computer/digital literacy that will help those students that are unable to take the 60-day cycle course during the school year due to band or choir courses. They will touch upon Google Docs, Sheets, Slides, Drive and Coding. (Grades 7 and 8) ***Out of district students welcomed***

Create a Digital Portfolio: Employers and colleges often require a portfolio to accompany their applications. Learn how to professionally create an online, digital portfolio that could include print, video and sound. Students leave with useable portfolio to which they can continue to add materials. (Grades 9 to 12) ***Out of district students welcomed***

Get Fired Up! Summer Clay Studio: Students will experience every aspect of what it is like to be a ceramic artist. Creating with various techniques including, pinch-pots, slab-building, hand-building and wheel throwing too. Surface techniques will be covered to enhance each piece. Class time will include learning about glazing and the process of kiln firing. Students will have the opportunity to create several unique ceramic pieces during this workshop. (Grades 7 to 12) ***Out of district students welcomed***

SAT Reading Comp. / Writing and Language Prep.: Test taking techniques and ELA strategies to improve performance on the English portion of the SAT. (Grades 11 and 12) ***Out of district students welcomed***

Summer Band - Youth: Summer instrumental music program for middle school and elementary school students. Summer band allows students to continue playing their instrument and receive additional instruction from high school and middle school students, while also playing alongside advanced high school students. (Grades 7 and 8) (Elementary Instrumental Music Students - Grades 4 to 6) ***Out of district students welcomed***

Summer Movie Workshop: In this session students will work together to write, film, and edit their own short films. The Summer Movie Workshop is a 4-week enrichment program open to all Clearview students, including this year's graduates. It is a great opportunity for students to spend their summer in a fun, creative, and rewarding environment.

(Grades 9 to 12) ***CHS students only***

Personal Financial Literacy: The instruction for Personal Financial Literacy will be delivered online through APEX learning for high school credit. This course meets the NJ graduation requirement for Personal Finance Literacy. Regular attendance is necessary to achieve satisfactory progress in the course. Students will work at their own pace. (Grades 9 to 12) ***CHS students only***
