District Issued Chromebooks

In accordance with Policy 5513: Care of School Property, students are responsible for the proper care of school property and the school supplies and equipment entrusted to his/her use. Students and parents will be responsible for district- owned technology property that is issued to them, just as they are for other district-owned items such as text books, calculators, athletic equipment, or library books. The Clearview Regional School District recognizes that there is a need to protect the investment by both the district and the student/parent. If the device is damaged, the district will repair or replace it, but students/parents will be responsible for the cost of those repairs or replaced devices.

However, the liability on families/students can be reduced significantly by taking part in the district's Chromebook Protection Plan program. For \$30 (non-refundable), per device, the Chromebook Protection Plan program will repair or replace the device the first time damage occurs. If the Chromebook is repaired, the family will be offered to renew the Protection Plan for an additional \$30. This Protection Plan program covers accidental damage. It does NOT cover loss, theft, damage by flood/fire/intentional destruction. The district strongly recommends purchasing our Chromebook protection plan.



Choosing to enroll in the district's Chromebook Protection Plan is optional. You may elect to pay for damages out of pocket (Personal Liability). Parents/guardians who select no plan will be financially responsible for loss, theft, or all damages not covered by the manufacturer's warranty. Typical repair and replacement costs are listed below.

Replace entire Chromebook - \$300 Replace screen - \$90 Replace Chassis - \$100 Replace power cable/charger - \$30 Replace transport case - \$20 Replace keyboard/touchpad - \$50

In cases of theft, vandalism, and other criminal acts, a police report, or in the case of flood/fire, a flood/fire report must be filed by the parent or guardian. A copy of the police/flood/fire report must be provided to the school district in a timely manner.

Intentional or Repetitive Damage or Abuse: Parents/guardians are responsible for full payment of intentional damages/abuse to Chromebooks. The School District Protection Plan program does not cover intentional damage/abuse of the device.

Hardship Instructions: If your family qualifies for the Free/Reduced Meal Program through the Federal Government, you may request a one- time waiver of the insurance fee. If the device is damaged, you will be responsible for the insurance fee of \$30 thereafter. If you qualify, you will be notified of your adjusted fee. By checking Yes and signing the form, you have authorized the district to utilize the information that you have completed on the current Free/Reduced Meal Application.

Personal Device Use

Clearview Regional High School District students will be permitted to bring in their personal devices for use in school as long as students adhere to the district policies and regulations

Student personal devices (Laptops, notebooks, ultrabooks, netbooks, chromebooks, IOS Devices, Android Devices) will be provided filtered access to the Internet. Devices are valuable electronics that can be damaged. The Clearview Regional High School District is not responsible for the loss, theft, and/or damage of personal device(s). Neither shall the Clearview Regional High School District be liable for any unauthorized access to the device or the data that resides therin. In Addition:



Video Conferencing

Clearview Regional High School District may offer individual or group audio/video conferencing instruction at home to students who are learning remotely or to those students requiringing additional help from their teacher(s). Instruction may be live streamed to students participating remotely

Data & Privacy

Clearview Regional High School District respects your child's privacy. We take measures to keep your child's Personal Identifiable Information safe by adhering to FERPA and COPPA laws. Anti-Big Brother Act

The State of New Jersey requires us to inform you about the "Anti-Big Brother" Act: P.L.2013, CHAPTER 44, approved April 15, 2013, Senate No. 2057. This public law states that our district will provide "written or electronic notification that the electronic device may record or collect information on the student's activity or the student's use of the device if the electronic device is equipped with a camera, global positioning system, or other feature capable of recording or collecting information on the student's activity or use of the device." Clearview Regional High School District is utilizing a software program that monitors, filters, and tracks the location of students' Chromebooks. This program, called GoGuardian, records all Internet activity in the Chrome browser when students log in using their Clearview Google account. The monitoring and recording happens regardless of the device and the student's location. GoGuardian only monitors and collects Internet activity: it does not use the device webcam to capture photos or videos of students, staff members, or any school activities. This ensures that students use their devices for legitimate school purposes.

Please note that the Clearview School District shall not use any of GoGuardian's capabilities in a manner that would violate the privacy rights of the student or any individual residing with the student.



Children's Internet Protection Act

Clearview Regional High School District has taken precautions to eliminate controversial material in accordance with C.I.P.A. (Children's Internet Protection Act) However, it is impossible for Clearview Regional High School District to restrict access to all controversial materials. By signing this AUP you acknowledge you will not hold Clearview Regional High School District responsible for any content that manages to get past the filter.
